Chicago Bears (4-5) vs. Philadelphia Eagles (5-4) Sunday, November 22, 2009 -- 7:20pm CT Soldier Field (Natural Grass) -- 61,500



THIS WEEK vs. PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

The Chicago Bears (4-5) will play their second consecutive prime-time contest when they host the Philadelphia Eagles (5-4) on NBC's *Sunday Night Football* on November 22, at Soldier Field at 7:20 pm CT.

This is the second consecutive season the Bears have hosted the Eagles on *Sunday Night Football* after defeating Philadelphia, 24-20, in Chicago during a Week 4 prime-time game in 2008.

Chicago holds a 28-10-1 advantage in the all-time regular season series with Philadelphia that began in 1933. The Bears have won two-straight meetings in the series after snapping a five-game win streak by the Eagles in 2007. Chicago is 15-4 at home overall versus Philadelphia including 14-3 during the regular season.

The Bears are 6-2 (.750) in primetime home games under Head Coach **Lovie Smith** including 4-2 (.667) on NBC's *Sunday Night Football*. The Monsters of the Midway are 11-8 (.579) overall in primetime contests since 2004 but 0-3 this season.

In 2009, Chicago is 3-1 at home with wins in their first three contests at Soldier Field (17-14 over Pittsburgh in Week 2; 48-24 over Detroit in Week 4 and 30-6 over Cleveland in Week 8) before a 41-21 defeat to Arizona in Week 9.

THE HEAD COACHES

CHICAGO BEARS

Lovie Smith

Lovie Smith is in his sixth season as the head coach of the Chicago Bears with a regular season coaching record of 49-40 (.551). Smith's 51 overall wins (2-2 in the playoffs) are third most in franchise history, trailing only Hall of Famers George Halas (324) and Mike Ditka (112). Smith reached the 50-win plateau in Week 4, doing so in 86 overall contests, tied with Carolina's John Fox for third fastest among active head coaches trailing only Andy Reid (81) and Tom Coughlin (83). Smith signed on as the Bears 13th head coach all-time on Jan. 15, 2004, and guided the team to its first Super Bowl appearance in 21 years three seasons later. He is the first coach in franchise history to lead the team to the playoffs in two of his first three seasons after the Bears won the NFC North title in 2005 and 2006. The 2005 NFL Coach-of-the-Year came to Chicago from St. Louis where he was the Rams defensive coordinator for three seasons (2001-03). In Smith's first season in St. Louis he helped the Rams return to the Super Bowl. The native Texan took over the Rams defense after five seasons as Tampa Bay's linebackers coach. Smith began 27 years as a collegiate and professional coach at his alma mater, Tulsa, in 1983 with five other college stops along the way before moving on to the NFL. He got his first taste of coaching at his hometown high school, Big Sandy, in 1980 before moving to Cascia Hall Prep in Tulsa.

PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

Andy Reid

A two-time NFL coach of the year honoree, Reid has led the Eagles to the playoffs in seven of his 10 seasons as the head coach heading into 2009, including five NFC Championship game appearances and a trip to Super Bowl XXXIX. He was named coach of the year for the first time in 2000 when the Eagles completed a six-game turnaround in his second season, finishing second in the NFC East and reaching the divisional playoffs. Reid once again took home the honor in 2002 as he led Philadelphia to a 12-4 record, NFC East title and NFC Championship game appearance. Over 11 seasons, Reid has compiled the best win total (112) and playoff victories (10) in team history, while guiding his team to five division titles and five NFC Championship berths. A Super Bowl champion with the Packers, Reid spent seven seasons in Green Bay under Mike Holmgren, helping guide them to the playoffs six times and tutored Brett Favre during his MVP season in 1997. A graduate of Brigham Young University, Reid started his coaching career at his alma mater as a graduate assistant in 1982 and followed that with stints at San Francisco State, Northern Arizona, Texas El-Paso and Missouri.

BEARS -- EAGLES SERIES

SERIES HISTORY: The Bears lead the series with 28 wins in 39 contests, including a victory last year in the Windy City. Chicago has won two straight in the series after snapping a five-game losing streak in 2008. The Bears and Eagles met for the first time in 1933 and battled to a 3-3 tie. The next 11 games belonged to the Bears as Chicago won by an average margin of 24 points over a 13-year period (1935-47). The Eagles managed their first win ever versus Chicago in 1948 (12-7), but went on to lose seven of the next nine match-ups from 1949-75. Philadelphia recorded its first win streak in the series from 1979-80 when the Eagles beat Chicago twice in as many years (1979 Wild Card, 27-17 and 1980, 17-14). Chicago broke Philadelphia's streak in 1983 with a 7-6 win and went on another winning binge, capturing the next six games between the teams, including the famous Fog Bowl triumph (20-12) in the 1988 Divisional Playoffs. The Eagles other wins since 1980 were a 30-22 Monday Night victory over Chicago in 1994, a 20-16 victory in 1999 at Soldier Field, 2001's 33-19 playoff victory and 19-9 in 2004. In 28 Bears victories, Chicago has beaten Philadelphia by an average margin of more than two touchdowns (14.7 PPG, 725-313). In 10 Eagles victories, Philadelphia has beaten Chicago by an average margin of less than a touchdown (6.6 PPG, 206-140).

LAST MEETING: Chicago QB Kyle Orton threw for a career-high three touchdown passes and the Bears defense kept the Eagles out of the end zone on three straight plays from the 1-yard line with just over five minutes remaining in the game in a 24-20 victory by the Monsters of the Midway on NBC's *Sunday Night Football* at Soldier Field. LAST GAME AGAINST PHILADELPHIA

Chicago 24, Philadelphia 20
 Sunday, September 28, 2008 -- Soldier Field

CHICAGO -- The Bears defense came up with a late goal-line stand that enabled Chicago to hold on to a 24-20 victory over the Philadelphia Eagles on Sunday night at Soldier Field.

Protecting a four-point fourth-quarter lead, Chicago's defense kept the Eagles out of the end zone on three straight plays from the 1-yard line with just over five minutes in the game.

After safeties Mike Brown and **Kevin Payne** teamed up to drop Tony Hunt for no gain on second-and-goal from the 1-yard line, Correll Buckhalter was stuffed by **Adewale Ogunleye** on third down and **Alex Brown** on fourth down from inside the 1-yard line with 3:32 left in the fourth quarter.

The Bears defense held the Eagles to six second-half points on eight possessions, including four drives that ended inside the Chicago 30-yard line.

On offense, Kyle Orton threw touchdown passes of 19 yards to **Greg Olsen**, 23 yards to Marty Booker and 20 yards to **Devin Hester** as the Bears surged to a 21-14 halftime lead. Orton finished the day 18 of 34 passing for 199 yards with a career-high three touchdown passes and two interceptions for a 75.5 passer rating.

Trailing 21-14, the Eagles took over at the Chicago 28 after Trent Cole sacked Orton, forcing a fumble that Omar Gaither returned six yards. Jason Avant's four-yard catch resulted in first-and-goal at the 2. But Donovan McNabb threw an incomplete pass, lost four yards when he tripped on a teammate after taking the snap, and threw another incompleton. Philadelphia then settled for David Akers' 24-yard field goal, cutting the deficit to 21-17.

The Eagles later recovered a botched handoff between Orton and RB **Kevin Jones** at the Chicago 31. But the Bears defense held the Eagles to just 18 yards on six plays, forcing Philadelphia to settle for Akers' 31-yard field goal, which trimmed the margin to 21-20 early in the final period.

Robbie Gould's 41-yard field goal with 10:28 remaining gave the Bears a 24-20 edge. The kick was set up by running back **Matt Forté's** 17-yard reception on third-and-seven and Hester's 15-yard reverse to the Philadelphia 25. Forté had 43 yards on 19 carries, producing a critical first down with a 10-yard run on third-and-four from the Chicago 7 with 2:33 left in the game. He added a team-high five receptions for 42 yards.

The Eagles didn't get the ball back again until there was just 17 seconds left to play. McNabb completed a 14-yard pass to Reggie Brown to the Chicago 47, but Brown failed to get out of bounds and the final seconds ticked off the clock.

In the first half, the Bears offense scored 21 of their 24 points. Orton completed a 34-yard pass to **Rashied Davis** on Chicago's first play from scrimmage and then hit Olsen in the back of the end zone two snaps later to give Chicago a 7-0 lead. The Eagles answered on McNabb's 22-yard TD strike to rookie DeSean Jackson, tying the game 7-7.

Booker's first TD reception as a Bear since 2003 gave Chicago a 14-7 lead. The touchdown came after **Nick Roach** recovered Jackson's muffed punt at the Philadelphia 24.

But the Eagles responded on their ensuing possession as Buckhalter's one-yard touchdown dive capped a five-play, 67-yard drive that took just 2:18 and tied the game 14-14.

Orton gave the Bears a 21-14 lead when he threw his third scoring strike with 1:16 left in the half on a fade route to Hester, who beat CB Asante Samuel.

Since its bye weekend (Week 5), Chicago has converted 45.8 percent of their third down attempts (33 of 72), tied for seventh-best average in the NFL during that span.

On the season, Chicago has completed 40.7 percent of its third downs (50 of 123), 14th in the NFL, the highest percentage for the franchise since 1995 (88 of 207, 42.5 percent). The last time the Bears finished in the top 20 in third down offense was 1999 (91 of 247, 36.8 percent; tied for 13th).

In 2009, the Bears have converted 50 percent or more of their third downs in three contests, a feat they accomplished just twice in each of the last two seasons.

BOWMAN GRABS INT. IN TWO STRAIGHT

Bears CB **Zackary Bowman** picked off his third pass of the season in Week 10 at San Francisco, four days after recording an interception versus Arizona in Week 9.

Bowman is the first Chicago defensive player to record an interception in back-to-back games since **Brian Urlacher** during Weeks 11 and 12 of the 2008 season. He is the first Bears cornerback to accomplish the feat since **Charles Tillman** during Weeks 12 and 13 in 2007.

Bowman leads the team with three interceptions on the year. The second-year cornerback now has four interceptions in 10 career games played.

BRIGGS NEARS 100-TACKLE PLATEAU

SMITH REACHES 50-WIN PLATEAU IN WEEK 4

With the Bears 48-24 victory over the Detroit Lions in Week 4, Chicago Bears Head Coach **Lovie Smith** earned his 50th career victory with the franchise.

Smith became just the third head coach in franchise history to reach the 50-win plateau joining Hall of Famers George Halas (324) and Mike Ditka (112).

Smith is one of 11 current NFL coaches with at least 50 victories (including playoffs). He reached that plateau in just his 88th game, which is faster than Wade Phillips (92), Jack Del Rio (92), Jeff Fisher (93), Marvin Lewis (102), Bill Belichick (111), Norv Turner (111) and Dick Jauron (118). John Fox also did it in 88 games, while Andy Reid (81) and Tom Coughlin (83) got there quicker.

Smith has also reached the 50-win milestone in fewer games than legendary NFL coaches Bill Parcells (89), Bill Walsh (91), Chuck Noll (94) and Tom Landry (119).

Smith is 49-40 during the regular season and 2-2 in the playoffs in his six-year tenure with the team.
