THE MATCH-UP

Kansas City begins a daunting stretch of four straight contests against NFC East foes when the Chiefs make their debut appearance at Lincoln Financial Field on Sunday in Philadelphia (9/27). The Chiefs enter this week's interconference clash after a tough 13-10 loss vs. Oakland (9/20). Despite dominating the Raiders in total offense (409 to 166), first downs (25 to 11), rushing yards (173 to 67) and time of possession (38:39 to 21:21), the Chiefs could not register their first victory of the head coach Todd Haley era.

Philadelphia enters this contest after suffering a 48-22 loss vs. New Orleans (9/20). Five-time Pro Bowl QB Donovan McNabb was sidelined with a rib injury for that contest, setting the stage for QB Kevin Kolb, who completed 31 of 51 passes for 391 yards with two TDs and three INTs against the Saints. QB Michael Vick is eligible to return to active duty this week. He last suited up for a regular season NFL contest for Atlanta in a 24-17 loss at Philadelphia (12/31/06). Four-time Pro Bowl QB Jeff Garcia is also on the Eagles roster.

Sunday's game will shorten the list of current NFL venues that Kansas City hasn't visited to Cowboys Stadium (Dallas) and Lucas Oil Stadium (Indianapolis). This week's game will be played exactly 11 years to the day of Kansas City's last visit to the City of Brotherly Love in the Chiefs only game at Veterans Stadium (9/27/98).

Current Kansas City GM Scott Pioli was one of the architects of building a team in New England that claimed three Super Bowl titles over the past nine seasons, including a 24-21 win vs. Philadelphia in Super Bowl XXXIX. Eagles head coach Andy Reid has directed his squad to 93 regular season wins dating back to 2000. Only New England (103), Indianapolis (102 prior to MNF) and Pittsburgh (95) have more regular season wins this decade. Todd Haley is also familiar with the Eagles in the playoffs, calling the plays for the Cardinals in Arizona's win vs. Philadelphia in the 2008 NFC Championship Game.

Kansas City returns home to begin a two-game home stand vs. the N.Y. Giants (10/4) and Dallas (10/11). Philadelphia enjoys a bye next weekend before resuming its schedule with a home contest vs. Tampa Bay (10/11).

THE SERIES

Sunday's game will mark just the sixth-ever regular season meeting between the Chiefs and Eagles. Philadelphia holds a slim 3-2 edge in the regular season series. The Eagles have won back-to-back games against the Chiefs, claiming victories at Arrowhead in 2001 and 2005. Kansas City's only previous regular season contest in Philadelphia resulted in a 24-21 Chiefs win in the club's only appearance at Veterans Stadium (9/27/98).

Philadelphia's first win against Kansas City came in the inaugural contest between the two clubs by a 21-20 count at Arrowhead (10/22/72). Kansas City won the lone preseason game in the history of the series, claiming a 24-21 victory at Arrowhead (8/9/79).

CHIEFS HEAD COACH - TODD HALEY



Todd Haley was named the 11th head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs on February 6, 2009. The second-youngest head coach in franchise history at 42 years old, Haley enters his 15th season in the NFL in 2009. He is entering his 13th season as an NFL coach after beginning his career as a scouting assistant with the N.Y. Jets in '95.

Haley joined the Chiefs after a two-year stint as Arizona's offensive coordinator (2007-08), helping the Cardinals reach Super Bowl XLIII as the club won its first division title since '75. Under Haley's direction, the Cardinals ranked third in the league in scoring as Arizona registered a franchise-record 427 points in 2008. The Cardinals also threw a team-record 32 TD passes in 2007.

Haley has won division titles with four different NFL teams. He served as passing game coordinator/WRs coach under Bill Parcells with Dallas (2004-06) after beginning his career under Parcells with the N.Y. Jets ('97-00). He also served as WRs coach with Chicago (2001-03). Born on February 28, 1967, Haley grew up in Upper St. Clair, PA and graduated from North Florida in '91. He is the son of longtime NFL personnel executive Dick Haley, who helped build the Steelers Super Bowl teams of the '70s.

EAGLES HEAD COACH - ANDY REID



Andy Reid was named head coach of the Eagles on January 11, 1999. He owns the most career victories (108) and the best winning percentage (.606) of any coach in Philadelphia history. He has earned NFL Coach of the Year honors twice and has won more playoff games (10) than any other field general in Eagles annals. Under his jurisdiction, the Eagles have won seven division titles and reached the NFC Championship Game on five occasions.

Under Reid, the Eagles traveled to Super Bowl XXXIX, made four straight NFC Championship Game appearances (2001-2004) and made five consecutive appearances in the playoffs (2000-04). Reid entered the NFL in '92 as an assistant coach with the Green Bay Packers under Mike Holmgren, and was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XXXI with the Packers. In total, he has coached in three Super Bowls and five Pro Bowls.

Born on March 19, 1958 in Los Angeles, California, Reid played T and G at Brigham Young University before coaching at BYU ('82), San Francisco State ('83-85), Northern Arizona ('86), Texas-El Paso ('87-88), and Missouri ('89-91).

50 YEARS OF CHIEFS FOOTBALL

- The Kansas City Chiefs are celebrating their 50th anniversary season in 2009.
- Founded by Lamar Hunt in '59, the franchise began play as the Dallas Texans as a charter member of the American Football League in '60 before moving to Kansas City in '63.
- Under the guidance of Hall of Fame head coach Hank Stram, the Texans/Chiefs won league titles in '62, '66 and '69.
- The Chiefs faced Green Bay in Super Bowl I and defeated heavily-favored Minnesota in Super Bowl IV, the final game in AFL history.
- The Chiefs have sold out 150 consecutive regular and postseason contests at Arrowhead, which is undergoing a \$375-million facelift.
- The franchise has won or shared eight AFL or AFC Western Division titles ('62, '66, '68, '62, '71, '93, '95, '97 and 2003).



THE PIOLI ERA BEGINS

- Scott Pioli was named the fifth General Manager in Kansas City history by Chairman of the Board Clark Hunt on January 13, 2009.
- During his tenure in New England, the Patriots won Super Bowls XXXVI, XXXVIII and XXXIX, claimed the Lamar Hunt Trophy four times as the AFC Champion and won six AFC East titles.
- Was named the "Personnel Man of the Decade" by ESPN in 2009, Pioli is a four-time winner of NFL Executive of the Year honors.
- During his previous 17 NFL seasons, teams Pioli has been associated with have won seven division titles, made eight playoff appearances and have participated in a total of 21 playoff games.
- During his nine-year run with New England (2000-08), the Patriots compiled an NFL-best 102-42 (.708) regular season record.
- New England accumulated 11 playoff victories from 2003-07, the highest total by any team over a five-year span in NFL history.

THE AFL'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY SEASON

- The American Football League was officially born on August 14, 1959 when less than two weeks after his 27th birthday, Lamar Hunt called to order a meeting in Chicago.
- On April 8, 1966, Hunt and Cowboys executive Tex Schramm met in Dallas beginning merger negotiations that culminated on June 8, 1966.
- The Chiefs will participate in three "AFL Rivalry Games" and will wear classic Dallas Texans uniforms from their '62 AFL Championship season vs. Dallas (10/11), vs. San Diego (10/25) and at Oakland (11/15).



CHIEFS COACHES WITH SUPER BOWL EXPERIENCE

Chiefs head coach Todd Haley served as Arizona's offensive coordinator in the 2008 NFC Championship Game vs. Philadelphia (1/18/09). Trailing 25-24 in the fourth quarter, the Cardinals orchestrated a 14-play, 72-yard drive that consumed 7:52 off the clock to give Arizona a 32-25 lead after a successful two-point conversion. Current Chiefs defensive coordinator Clancy Pendergast served in that same capacity for Arizona last season. Pendergast's defensive unit halted the Eagles final drive, propelling the Cardinals to their first-ever Super Bowl berth. In total, eight different Chiefs coaches have experience in 13 Super Bowls as either players or coaches.

2009 KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Kansas City enters 2009 under the guidance of first-year head coach Todd Haley. QB Matt Cassel joined the Chiefs in an off-season trade with New England. Cassel returned from injury to make his first start in a Chiefs uniform



vs. Oakland (9/20) after QB Brodie Croyle (D3-06) started at Baltimore (9/13) and compiled a 116.1 rating. Two-time Pro Bowl RB Larry Johnson (D1-03) needs 335 more yards to surpass RB Priest Holmes (6,070) as the all-time leading rusher in franchise history. G Mike Goff was added to an offensive front that includes four-time Pro Bowl

G Brian Waters, T Branden Albert (D1b-08), C Rudy Niswanger and recently-acquired G/T Ikechuku Ndukwe. KC's receiving corps features a trio of ex-Bears: WRs Bobby Engram, Bobby Wade and Mark Bradley. WR Dwayne Bowe (D1-07) posted 1,022 yards in 2008, while Wade had a team-high 72 yards vs. Oakland (9/20).

Pro Bowl LB Mike Vrabel was acquired in an off-season trade with New England. LB Tamba Hali (D1-06) had a sack and his 12th career forced fumble at Baltimore (9/13), while LB Derrick Johnson (D1-05) registered a career-long 70-yard INT return. DEs Glenn Dorsey (D1a-08), Tyson Jackson (D1-09) and DT Tank Tyler (D3-07) anchor KC's defensive front.

Former Pro Bowl S Mike Brown was added in the off-season. S Jon McGraw blocked a punt for a TD at Baltimore (9/13). S Jarrad Page (D7-06), CBs Brandon Flowers (D2-08), Brandon Carr (D5-08) and Maurice Leggett round out a secondary that also includes CB Donald Washington (D4-09). P Dustin Colquitt (D3-05) is fourth in the NFL with a 43.5-yard net average in 2009. Rookie K Ryan Succop (D7c-09) nailed a 53-yard FG at Baltimore (9/13), the longest kick by a KC rookie since HOF K Jan Stenerud made a 54-yarder in '67. RB Dantrell Savage and WR Quinten Lawrence (D6-09) return kickoffs. WR Bobby Wade handled the punt returns vs. Oakland (9/20).

2009 PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

The Philadelphia Eagles are in their 11th season under head coach Andy Reid. Five-time Pro Bowl QB Donovan McNabb (D1-99) owns a 83-45-1 (.647) record as an NFL starter. Four-time Pro Bowl QB Jeff Garcia and QB Kevin Kolb (D2-07) and former Falcons QB Michael Vick give the club a wealth of talent at that position.



Two-time Pro Bowl RB Brian Westbrook (D3-02) has accumulated 9,468 yards from scrimmage and 65 total TDs over his career. Former Rams WR Kevin Curtis leads a young receiving corps that includes DeSean Jackson (D2b-08), University of Missouri product Jeremy Maclin (D1-09) and TE Brent Celek (D5b-07). The Eagles offensive front is anchored by T Jason Peters, who was acquired in

an off-season trade with Buffalo and mans the left tackle post. T Winston Justice (D2-06) works at right tackle, while G Stacy Andrews joined the club from Cincinnati in 2009. C Jamaal Jackson and G Nick Cole round out the blocking unit.

Pro Bowl DE Trent Cole (D5a-05) owns 36.5 career sacks and leads the defensive front. He is joined by DTs Mike Patterson (D1-05) and Brodrick Bunkley (D1-06) and DE Victor Abiamiri (D2b-07) on the defensive line. LB Stewart Bradley (D3a-07) finished second on the team with 151 tackles in 2008. He is accompanied by LBs Chris Gocong (D3-06) and Akeem Jordan. Two-time Pro Bowl CB Asante Samuel entered the league as a fourth-round pick with New England in 2003. He owns 27 career INTs. He works in the Eagles defensive backfield with CB Sheldon Brown (D2b-02) and Ss Quintin Mikell and Macho Harris (D5-09).

Three-time Pro Bowl K David Akers is the franchise's all-time leader with 1,059 points and 233 made FGs. He owns a career FG make percentage of 80.9. Former Australian Football League P Sav Socca is in his third NFL campaign. Former Patriots CB Ellis Hobbs returns kickoffs and owns three career KOR TDs. WR DeSean Jackson (D2b-08) handles the punt return duties.

CHIEFS INSIDER: *Chiefs Insider* hosted by Mitch Holthus is the official pregame TV show of the Chiefs and airs at 9:30 AM (CT) on KCTV-5 in Kansas City.

22 PLAYOFF TEAMS HAVE STARTED 0-2 SINCE 1990

Dating back to '90, 22 teams have started the regular season with an 0-2 record and have still qualified for the playoffs. The list includes the 2006 Chiefs, who earned an AFC Wild Card berth and the 2003 Eagles, who reached the NFC Championship Game. Chiefs GM Scott Pioli and head coach Todd Haley were both members of the N.Y. Jets organization in '98 when the Jets rebounded from an 0-2 start to reach the AFC Championship Game. Pioli served as New England's Director of Player Personnel in 2001 when the Patriots started 0-2 and went on to win Super Bowl XXXVI. The '93 Cowboys, 2001 Patriots and 2007 N.Y. Giants are the only three squads since '90 that have started 0-2 and have won the Super Bowl. Of the 22 teams to start 0-2 since '90 and still qualify for the playoffs, 19 of those teams have won their third regular season game.

Chiefs Make a Rare Road Trip to Philadelphia

The Chiefs will make their first appearance in Philadelphia in 11 years, playing for the first time at Lincoln Financial Field. Kansas City's last visit to Philadelphia resulted in a 24-21 win at Veterans Stadium (9/27/98). KC's last two wins in debut appearances at new NFL venues have both come against NFC foes. KC claimed a 23-20 win at Arizona (10/8/06) in the Chiefs inaugural visit to University of Phoenix Stadium. KC's most recent victory against an NFC East foe came by a 45-13 count at Washington (9/30/01) in the club's debut at FedEx Field.

While it's been 11 years since the Chiefs last visited Philadelphia, it doesn't hit the list of the longest active dry spells between visits to an opposing city. Last week, Tampa Bay played in Buffalo for the first time since the Bucs entered the NFL in '76, snapping the league's longest drought entering the season, meaning the 21-year span between visits to Washington by Pittsburgh ranks as the longest active streak. This week the Colts will play at Arizona for the first time since '90.

Chiefs Traditionally Strong vs. NFC Opponents

From '95-08, Kansas City posted a 31-25 (.554) mark against NFC foes, the NFL's ninth-best interconference mark over that span. With a slate of four consecutive contests vs. NFC East opponents upcoming - the only division in football that featured four teams with .500 or better records in 2008 - KC's interconference edge will be tested.

Kansas City's last victory vs. an NFC foe was a 13-10 win vs. Minnesota (9/23/07). The 2008 campaign marked the first time since '88 that the club did not register at least one victory against an interconference opponent. The Eagles are 22-17-1 (.563) under Andy Reid against AFC foes, including a 1-1-1 record in their last three contests.

Philadelphia is 30-19 (.612) in regular season play at Lincoln Financial Field. The Eagles are 8-4 (.667) all-time vs. AFC foes at that venue, including a streak of four straight wins. Tennessee was the last AFC squad to register a win on the Eagles home turf, notching a 31-13 victory (11/19/06).

Eagles Quarterbacks Career Stats vs. the Chiefs

Three different signal callers on the Philadelphia roster have combined to post a 5-1 record as starters in their previous meetings with Kansas City. However, none of those signal callers have ever faced the Chiefs in Philadelphia, and only QB Donovan McNabb has met the Chiefs in an Eagles uniform. McNabb is 2-0 as an Eagles starter at Arrowhead.

QB Jeff Garcia is 3-0 against the Chiefs, going 2-0 with San Francisco and 1-0 with Tampa Bay. He is the Eagles QB who most recently met the Chiefs. Last year he rallied the Bucs from a 21-point deficit to register a 30-27 OT win at Arrowhead (11/2/08). QB Michael Vick is eligible to join the Eagles active roster this week. He suffered a 56-10 loss with the Falcons in a start at Arrowhead (10/24/04). QB Kevin Kolb made his first career start vs. New Orleans (9/20), completing 31 of 51 passes (60.8%) for 391 yards with two TDs and three INTs, numbers that equated to a 73.2 rating.

Chiefs-Eagles Scoring Stats

Philadelphia has allowed 23.8 ppg in 49 regular season games at Lincoln Financial Field. In 30 home wins over that span, the Eagles have outscored their opponents by an average margin of 29.4 to 13.0. Philadelphia is 23-1 (.958) all-time at home under Andy Reid when scoring 30 points or more. That only loss was a 36-31 setback vs. the N.Y. Giants (11/9/08).

Over the past five seasons, the Chiefs are 12-29 (.293) on the road, averaging 28.7 ppg in those 12 victories. KC scored 24 points at Baltimore (9/13), the most points any club had scored at Baltimore since the Ravens suffered a 44-20 loss vs. Indianapolis (12/9/07). The Chiefs are tied for ninth in the NFL with 17 fourth-quarter points, the same total they have scored in quarters 1-3. Unfortunately, KC has allowed a league-high 28 points in the fourth quarter, and only Cleveland (41) has permitted more points in the second half than KC (38). Philadelphia hasn't fared much better in the second half, permitting 31 points to rank 28th in the NFL.

In Philadelphia's 19 losses at Lincoln Financial Field, the Eagles have been outscored by an average margin of 28.3 to 16.1. The Eagles have been held to 21 points or less in 13 of those 19 losses. Philadelphia led the NFL in average margin of victory in 2008 with its nine wins coming by 20.22 ppg. Last week, the Eagles suffered a 48-22 home loss vs. New Orleans (9/20), marking the most points Philadelphia had relinquished at home since a 49-0 loss vs. Green Bay at Franklin Field (11/11/62).

More Data on QBs Matt Cassel, Donovan McNabb

Chiefs QB Matt Cassel owns a 4-1 record when he compiles a 100.0 rating or higher. Cassel made his first start in a Chiefs uniform last week in a 13-10 loss vs. Oakland (9/20). Cassel is 2-1 when he posts a 300-yard passing performance. Last week against the Eagles defense Saints QB Drew Brees completed 25 of 34 (73.5%) passes for 311 yards with three TDs and one INT for a 118.6 rating in a 48-22 win at Philadelphia (9/20).

Eagles QB Donovan McNabb is 2-0 as a starter vs. Kansas City and has posted a passer rating above 100.0 in both of those contests at Arrowhead. He had a 112.5 rating in a 23-10 win (11/29/01) and a 103.6 rating in a 37-31 win (10/2/05). Philadelphia is 37-1 (.974) in games when McNabb compiles a 100.0+ QB rating (min. 20 atts.) dating back to '99.

According to STATS, LLC, McNabb has registered 33 straight wins when he posts a rating of 100.0 or better (min. 20 atts.), the longest active streak in the league. KC has lost 11 straight games when an opposing passer has compiled a 100.0 rating or higher (min. 20 atts.). The Chiefs last victory in such a circumstance was a 31-17 win at St. Louis (11/5/06) when Rams QB Marc Bulger had a 106.6 rating. Last week, KC's defense allowed just seven completions and 99 net passing yards vs. Oakland (9/20).

Todd Haley vs. Andy Reid, Remembering Jim Johnson

The biggest victory of Todd Haley's coaching career thus far was a 35-32 win in the 2008 NFC Championship Game vs. Philadelphia (1/18/09) as the Cardinals earned a berth in Super Bowl XLIII. Haley was also an assistant on a Cowboys squad that swept the Eagles in 2005, including a 21-20 win at Lincoln Financial Field (11/14/05).

Eagles head coach Andy Reid owns a 2-0 record against the Chiefs. Reid has posted a 3-0 record or better against Minnesota (3-0 reg. season/2-0 playoffs) and Cleveland (3-0). The Chiefs are seeking to avoid becoming the third squad Reid has faced three or more times without a defeat.

When asked in the off-season the toughest opposing coach he had faced as an NFL assistant, Haley quickly replied: "Eagles defensive coordinator Jim Johnson. Knows his stuff and his defense is always ready." The Chiefs join the rest of the league in mourning Johnson's loss.

Chiefs-Eagles Turnover Tidbits

Dating back to Dick Vermeil's final season as Kansas City's head coach in 2005, the Chiefs are 25-41 (.379) in the regular season. The Chiefs are +32 (60 takes/28 gives) in those 25 victories and -27 (53 takes/80 gives) in those 41 losses. The Eagles have won five straight games when positive in the turnover department. Philadelphia is 18-4 (.818) at Lincoln Financial Field with a positive turnover differential. The Eagles registered seven takeaways (5 INTs/2 FRs) in a season-opening 38-10 win at Carolina (9/13), but were -3 (1 take/4 gives) in a 48-22 loss vs. New Orleans (9/20). The Chiefs were -2 (0 takes/2 gives) last week vs. Oakland (9/20).

Chiefs-Eagles Rushing Matchup Features Johnson, Westbrook

The Chiefs own a 22-8 (.733) record when RB Larry Johnson rattles off a 100-yard rushing game, including a 3-3 mark vs. NFC opponents. Johnson had seven carries for 34 yards in his only previous appearance vs. Philadelphia (10/2/05). Johnson has 5,736 career rushing yards and needs 335 more to surpass RB Priest Holmes (6,070) as the all-time leading rusher in Chiefs history. Johnson had 119 yards from scrimmage (78 rush/41 rec.) vs. Oakland (9/20).

Philadelphia is 14-4 (.778) when RB Brian Westbrook records a 100-yard rushing game, including wins in nine of the Eagles last 10 games in that scenario. The Eagles ranked fourth in the NFL in rushing defense in 2008, permitting 92.3 ypg. Philadelphia's defense has gone nine consecutive games without allowing a 100-yard back. Giants RB Brandon Jacobs was the last to accomplish the feat with a 126-yard effort (11/9/08).

Final Statistical Tidbits on Kansas City at Philadelphia

Dating back to '90, the Chiefs own a 44-29 (.603) regular season record during the month of September, the league's second-best mark over that span behind Denver at 49-25 (.662) ... The Chiefs are fifth in the NFL in net punting (43.5 avg.) and in opp. punt return average (1.8 avg.) ... K Ryan Succop's 53-yard FG at Baltimore (9/13) is the second-longest in the NFL in 2009 ... Only Pittsburgh (31.4%) ranked better in third-down defense than Philadelphia (32.2%) a year ago. The Eagles are fifth in that category in 2009 at 31.9% (9 of 29) ... Only Pittsburgh (156.9 ypg) and Baltimore (179.7 ypg) allowed fewer passing yards than Philadelphia (182.1 ypg) in 2008, while only Dallas (59.0) and Pittsburgh (51.0) registered more sacks than Philadelphia (48.0) a year ago.

Kansas City started quick against the Eagles, jumping out to a 17-point lead before the visitors knew what hit them. The Chiefs would push their advantage to 24-6, however the rest was all Philadelphia as the Eagles stormed back for a 37-31 win. QB Donovan McNabb threw for 369 yards and three TDs and Philadelphia converted four Kansas City turnovers into 24 points en route to the victory.

RB Priest Holmes got Kansas City started on the Chiefs first drive, touching the ball on seven of the team's nine plays and scoring on a three-yard TD dive. A 38-yard field goal from Lawrence Tynes put Kansas City up 10-0 late in the first quarter.

On the ensuing kickoff, CB Dewayne Washington stripped Eagles return man CB Roderick Hood and the Chiefs recovered at the Philadelphia 27-yard line. QB Trent Green would then hit WR Eddie Kennison for an eight-yard TD pass as the Chiefs grabbed a 17-0 lead. Philadelphia finally cracked the scoreboard when CB Sheldon Brown intercepted Green and returned it 40 yards for a TD. The score remained 17-6 when the Eagles two-point attempt failed.

Just when it looked like the Chiefs might be losing momentum, WR Dante Hall took the stage. On the ensuing kickoff, Hall raced to a 96-yard touchdown. Hall's score gave Kansas City a 24-6 lead and tied an NFL record with his sixth career kickoff return score. However, it was the last the Chiefs would see of the momentum.

The Chiefs suffered a costly fumble just before half-time to shift the flow of the game. The Eagles gained possession near midfield and a McNabb-to-Owens seven-yard TD pass cashed in the turnover and gave Philadelphia life.

The Chiefs defense held Eagles RB Brian Westbrook to just 15 yards in the game, but the McNabb-to-Owens combo was too much. Philadelphia got a 44-yard field goal before passes of 30 and 28 yards to Owens set up a three-yard TD pass to TE Mike Bartrum. The Eagles tied the game at 24-24 after a successful two-point conversion. The Eagles regained possession and rattled off a nine-play, 71-yard drive that resulted in the go-ahead 37-yard field goal.

Trailing by three and still fighting, another Chiefs fumble handed the ball back to Philadelphia at the Kansas City 25-yard line. McNabb would find TE L.J. Smith open in the end zone just moments later for a 34-24 lead in the middle of the fourth quarter.

Philadelphia would tack on another field goal before the Chiefs offense added a late 15-yard TD pass to Hall as Kansas City closed the gap to 37-31 with 1:24 remaining. When the Chiefs failed to recover the onside kick, the Eagles ran out the clock for the victory.

In typical Chiefs-Raiders fashion, a tight game came right down to the wire as both clubs scored TDs in the final three minutes. Raiders QB JaMarcus Russell orchestrated a nine-play, 69-yard drive that was capped by a five-yard TD run by RB Darren McFadden with 1:07 left to play as Oakland registered a 13-10 victory at Arrowhead.

The Chiefs dominated the contest statistically outgaining the Raiders in total yards by a 409-to-166-yard margin. Kansas City held the ball for 38:39 compared to a 21:21 time of possession for the Raiders. The Chiefs also had over a two-to-one edge in first downs (25 to 11) and rushing yards (173 to 67).

The contest started on a positive note for the Chiefs as QB Matt Cassel made his first regular start after a knee injury kept him out of the season opener. On his first possession, Cassel found newly-acquired WR Bobby Wade for 16 yards, keeping Kansas City's drive alive. Facing fourth and two from the Oakland 40-yard line, head coach Todd Haley elected to go for it, and a three-yard rush by RB Jackie Battle kept the chains moving. Kansas City penetrated to the Raiders 13-yard line, but couldn't convert on third and nine, setting up a 23-yard K Ryan Succop FG that capped a 17-play, 74-yard drive that ate 9:25 off the clock and gave the Chiefs a 3-0 advantage.

Kansas City's defense forced a third consecutive three and out before the Raiders mounted their first serious scoring threat of the game. QB JaMarcus Russell connected on an 18-yard pass to rookie WR Darius Heyward-Bey and found RB Michael Bush for a 17-yard gain to propel the Raiders. However, Oakland was forced to settle for a 48-yard FG by K Sebastian Janikowski to tie the score at 3-3 with 4:45 left in the second quarter.

With time winding down in the first half, the Chiefs once again appeared poised to add to the scoreboard. Cassel guided the club to the Oakland nine-yard line, setting the team up with first and goal. But the Chiefs were out of timeouts and RB Dantrell Savage was tackled in bounds on the half's final play, thwarting a golden scoring opportunity.

The Chiefs received the ball to open the second half and Cassel had the Chiefs on the move again. But that momentum was short-lived as a Cassel pass was picked off by Raiders S Michael Huff. The Raiders gained one first down before their drive stalled, setting up a 54-yard FG by Janikowski to give Oakland a 6-3 lead with 8:33 remaining in the third quarter.

Two possessions later, Huff would once again victimize Cassel, this time intercepting him at the six-yard line. Oakland would again be forced to give it back to KC.

A steady Chiefs drive brought them to the Oakland 29-yard line, then Cassel went deep down the left sideline where WR Dwayne Bowe hauled in a 29-yard TD. Cassel's first TD pass in a Chiefs uniform highlighted a nine-play, 72-yard drive that gave Kansas City a 10-6 lead with 2:38 remaining.

Oakland took over on its own 31-yard line and drove to the Chiefs 14-yard line with 1:17 left. McFadden caught a nine-yard pass then added a five-yard TD run to punctuate a nine-play, 69-yard drive putting the Raiders ahead with 1:07 left in the game.

The Chiefs regained possession at their own 20 with 1:07 left and all three timeouts remaining, but Cassel was sacked on third and one and his fourth down pass fell incomplete, allowing Oakland to run out the clock and take home a 13-10 victory.
