THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

The Eagles open the 2008 preseason on the road as they travel across the state of Pennsylvania to take on the Pittsburgh Steelers. This marks the sixth-straight preseason in which the two teams have met, and the 34th time overall (16-16-1). The Eagles are coming off of an up-and-down 2007 season in which they went 8-8 but finished strong, winning their final 3 contests. The Steelers went 10-6 in 2007, winning the AFC North under new head coach Mike Tomlin, but fell to the Jaguars in the Wild Card round of the playoffs, 31-29.

A LOOK AT ETN'S CREW

Veteran play-by-play man **Gus Johnson** will call the action for the Eagles for the third-straight preseason. Known most notably for his coverage of the NFL and college basketball for CBS Sports, Johnson has also called play-by-play for college football, track and field, boxing, and the 1998 Winter Olympics.

A 16-year veteran NFL general manager and a 24-year NFL executive, **Charley Casserly** worked for the Washington Redskins (1977-1999) and Houston Texans (2000-06). He has also done work with many television and radio stations, including the NFL Network and most recently, CBS. Casserly currently serves as the "General Manager" for the CBS Television Network's NFL pregame show, *The NFL Today*.

Dave Spadaro reports from the sidelines of Eagles preseason games for the 11th season. He has also developed the team's official website, PhiladelphiaEagles.com, into one of the premier websites in all of sports.

OVER THE AIRWAVES

Eagles gameday action returns to WYSP/94.1 FM, entering its 17th season as the flagship station of the Philadelphia Eagles. In a first-of-its-kind agreement, games will also be heard live on CBS Radio sister station WIP/610 AM.

Merrill Reese will call play-by-play for his 32nd-straight season, which is tied for the longest current stretch in the NFL. Former Eagles all-pro WR **Mike Quick** enters his 11th season as color commentator.

OPPONENT INFORMATION

A LOOK AT THE COACHES

Andy Reid is one of the most successful head coaches in recent NFL history ... During his tenure, Reid has earned NFL coach of the year honors twice (2000, 2002) ... Compiled the best win total (96), and playoff victory total (8) in team history ... Has captured five division titles, four trips to the NFC Championship game, and a Super Bowl appearance (2004) ... Since he was hired in 1999, no other franchise has earned more divisional playoff round appearances (6) than Philadelphia ... Among coaches with 100 games under their belt, Reid's .608 winning pct. is 16th in NFL history and third among active coaches ... With 9 seasons under his belt in Philadelphia, Reid is tied for 3rd with Seattle's Mike Holmgren for NFL head coaching tenure with the same team (Tennessee's Jeff Fisher, 14; Denver's Mike Shanahan, 13).

Mike Tomlin is entering his second season as head coach of the Steelers ... Earned an AFC North division title in his first season in Pittsburgh, but suffered a loss in the Wild Card round to the Jacksonville Jaguars ... Previously Served as the Minnesota Vikings defensive coordinator in 2006 under head coach and former Eagles offensive coordinator Brad Childress.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

COACHES CORNER - Eagles secondary coach **Sean McDermott** was college teammates with Steelers head coach **Mike Tomlin**. The two played together at William and Mary in 1994, McDermott as a S and Tomlin as a WR. Eagles WR coach **David Culley** coached the Steelers WRs from 1996-98. Eagles DL coach **Pete Jenkins** coached with Assistant Head Coach/DL **John Mitchell** at LSU from 1987-90.

Steelers defensive coordinator **Dick LeBeau** was an assistant with the Eagles from 1973-75. Assistant head coach/DL coach **John Mitchell** was DEs coach at Temple in 1986. Offensive coordinator **Bruce Arians** was the head coach at Temple from 1983-88.

TRAINED IN THE 'BURGH - Eagles head athletic trainer **Rick Burkholder** is known as one of the NFL's best. He joined the Eagles in 1999 after six seasons with the Steelers. Burkholder designed a rehab program in 1995 for former Steelers CB Rod Woodson after he suffered a torn ACL on opening day. Four-and-a-half months after surgery, Woodson returned to play in Super Bowl XXX (the normal rehabilitation time is 9-12 months). Prior to his stint with the Steelers, Burkholder spent two seasons at the University of Pittsburgh, his alma mater.

WHAT'S UP, CUZ? - Eagles DE **Jerome McDougale** and Steelers FS **Tyrone Carter** are cousins. They are both graduates of Ely High in Pompano Beach, FL.

PITTSBURGH TIES - Eagles G/C **Cameron Stephenson** was drafted by the Steelers in the fifth-round (156th overall) of the 2007 NFL Draft. TE **Kris Wilson** played at Pittsburgh from 2000-03.

PHORMERLY PHROM PHILLY - Steelers WR **Jeremy Bloom** was drafted by the Eagles in the fifth round of the 2006 draft. Steelers WR **Gerran Walker** played collegiately at Lehigh University, the site of Eagles training camp.

BIG RED'S MACHINE

Andy Reid is entering his 10th season with the Eagles and has been one of the most successful head coaches in the NFL during that span. Reid has recorded the highest win total and pct. in team history and also ranks 16th on the NFL's all-time win pct. list.

REID ALL ABOUT IT

- Reid has captured 5 division titles in 7 years, including 4 consecutive division titles (2001-04), 4 trips to the NFC Championship game, the most playoff wins (8) in club history and led the team to its first Super Bowl appearance since 1980. He was named NFL coach of the year following the 2000 and 2002 seasons.
- Since 2000, has engineered 91 wins (including playoffs), the third-highest total in the NFL behind only Bill Belichick and Tony Dungy.
- Since 1990, only six of the 73 first-time head coaches remained with their original team for 8-or-more years: Reid (since 1999), Brian Billick (1999-2007 with Bal.), Jeff Fisher (since 1994 with Ten.), Bill Cowher (1992-2006 with Pit.), Dennis Green (1992-2001 with Min.), and Tom Coughlin (1995-2002 with Jax.).

OUTSTANDING OWNERSHIP

- With a 9-8 record in the playoffs during Lurie's tenure as owner, the Eagles have won and played in more postseason games than any ownership group in its history.

DIVISION DOMINANCE

- Since 1995, the Eagles have captured 5 division titles, including 5 in the last seven years. Only four other teams have won more division titles during that time span: New England (8), Green Bay (7), Pittsburgh (7), and Indianapolis (6).
- From 2001-2004, the Eagles captured the NFC East title in four consecutive seasons for the first time in team history, becoming the first team to win the NFC East four straight years since Dallas' stint from 1992-96.

A SUPER EXPERIENCE

- With a NFC Championship and an appearance in Super Bowl 39, Lurie became just the second owner in team history to lead a team to the Super Bowl.

DECADE OF DOMINANCE

Since 2000, Philadelphia has been one of the most successful franchises, owning the NFL's 3rd-best regular season record (83-45, .648) and the 4th-best overall record (91-51, .641).

OFFENSIVE TRADITION

The Eagles offense has been one of the most prolific in the NFL since 2004, ranking among the league's best in many of the important offensive categories. Over the past four seasons, the offense has finished in the top 10 three times (2004 - 8th; 2006 - 2nd; 2007 - 6th).

Since 2004, the Eagles offense ranks 2nd in the NFL in yards after the catch with 7,697. In 3 of the last 4 seasons, Philadelphia has ranked in the top 5 in the NFL: 2007 (7th - 1,813), 2006 (3rd - 2,147), 2005 (4th - 1,797), 2004 (3rd - 1,940).

SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

Defensive coordinator **Jim Johnson**, who is widely considered one of the premier defensive minds in the NFL, has put together a balanced unit that has excelled over the years. Johnson's ability to bring pressure from anywhere on the field has given opposing offenses all kinds of trouble. Since 2000, his units rank near the top of the NFL in many of the most important defensive categories:

Under Andy Reid's guidance, the Eagles have done a great job of protecting the ball and limiting turnovers, while also creating pressure and forcing other teams to cough it up. Since 1999, the Eagles rank 8th in the NFL and 2nd in the NFC with a +32 cumulative turnover ratio. Additionally, they have posted a positive turnover ratio in 7 out of the last 9 seasons.

WHEN THE EAGLES HAVE THE BALL

THE ULTIMATE WEAPON

An elite running back and one of the NFL's most electrifying players, RB **Brian Westbrook** turned in a record-breaking season with the Eagles in 2007. Westbrook led the NFL with 2,104 yards from scrimmage, breaking a franchise record and earning his 2nd-career Pro Bowl selection. He also demonstrated his ability to be a complete and versatile running back who can run the ball, catch it out of the backfield, and even provide great pass protection. Now, he is out to prove that last season was no fluke.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Since becoming a full-time starter in 2004, has amassed 6,768 yds. from scrimmage, the 2nd-highest total in the NFL.
- Is the only active player with 20-or-more TDs both rushing and receiving (27 rush & 23 rec.). According to ESB, was the 4th-fastest player in NFL history to do so (76 games).
- Has scored both a rushing TD and a TD recept. in the same game 8 times in his career. Only 4 players (1 active - Ahman Green) since 1970 have had more such games.
- Has averaged at least 4.0 yds./carry and 100 yards-or-more of total offense in 26 of his last 32 games (including playoffs).
- Is the only player in Eagles history to post 4,500 yds. rushing and 3,000 yds. receiving in his Eagles career.
- Among all players with at least 500 touches since 2004, Westbrook has the best touch/fumble ratio (1,152 touches, 4 fumbles; 288.0 touches/fumble).

BACK ON TRACK

After a strong finish to the 2007 season, QB **Donovan McNabb** is healthy, confident, and ready to lead the Eagles back to a spot among the NFC's elite. After a slow start in 2007, he really began to hit his stride in his last 8 starts, leading the team to a 6-2 record. Over the final 3 games of the season, all Eagles wins, he threw for a combined 816 yds. with 5 TDs, adding 90 yds. on the ground. Offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg thinks that McNabb is poised to have a great season.

"Of all the great players I have coached, Donovan, I think, has a chance to be a first-ballot Hall of Famer," said Mornhinweg. "Now, there is a little bit left to do here, but all the great players have that mentality that they are never done learning."

M McNABB'S WINNING WAYS:

McNabb has won a great deal of games during his career. The 9-year vet has a career record of 73-39, placing him 7th in the NFL all time in win pct. and 3rd among active QBs with at least 100 starts.

TOPPING THE CHARTS

One of the aspects of McNabb's game that has made him such a successful quarterback, is his ability to limit interceptions, while never shying away from making the big play. During the course of his career, McNabb has an INT% of only 2.12, tops in the NFL among active QBs and 2nd all-time. He also ranks 2nd among active QBs and 3rd all-time with a 2.16 TD/INT ratio.

WHEN THE EAGLES HAVE THE BALL

A PRODUCTIVE PAIR

Although they are not necessarily household names, the Eagles starting receivers both had productive 2007 seasons in terms of receptions and yards, which is impressive considering the Eagles have been an offense that relies heavily on spreading the ball to a variety different targets. In 2007, they were one of only 5 teams to have 2 WRs register over 60 receipts. and 750 yds. apiece. They were also the only team with 3 players to do so (RB Brian Westbrook, 90-771; WR Kevin Curtis, 77-1,110; WR Reggie Brown, 61-780).

CURTIS IS A CATCH

Kevin Curtis, a speedy and sure-handed receiver, is looking to build off of a strong 2007 campaign in which he established himself as a dangerous threat on the outside. He led the team with 1,110 receiving yds. and 49 first downs, adding 6 TDs (8 overall). In doing so, Curtis became just the 2nd Eagles receiver under Andy Reid to eclipse the 1,000-yd. mark (Terrell Owens in 2004). His 77 receipts. rank t-7th on the Eagles all-time single-season list.

AIRING IT OUT

WHAT AN AVANT-AGE

WR **Jason Avant** settled into his role in 2007 as a reliable and sure-handed target for Donovan McNabb, hauling in 23 rec. for 267 yds. and 2 TDs on the season. 15 of his 23 receipts. (65.2%) went for first downs, which was the highest pct. on the team.

PLAYING BASKETT-BALL

In 2006, WR **Hank Baskett** had a phenomenal rookie campaign, snagging 22 receptions for 464 yards and 2 TDs, the most yards for an undrafted player in his rookie season since Terrence Wilkins in 1999 (42-565-4). After a disappointing 2007 season, Baskett has focused on getting faster and more physical in order to use his strengths to his advantage.

"Every receiver's different," said Baskett. "I'm not going to be the quick, shaky guy. I tried to do that somewhat last year, and it set me back a step, trying to change my game instead of using what got me here."

HANDS LIKE G-LEW

A precise route runner with a knack for producing big plays, WR **Greg Lewis** has been a steady contributor for the Eagles since being signed as an undrafted rookie in 2003. Lewis led the team in 2007 with a 20.4 yds./catch avg. on 13 receipts, and set a career high with 3 TDs on the year.

THE MEN IN THE TRENCHES

The Eagles offensive line is now entering its 3rd season together as a unit, and is looking to build off of a 2007 season in which they helped pave the way for the NFL's yards-from-scrimmage leader, Brian Westbrook, who anchored a rushing attack that ranked 2nd in the NFL with a 4.7 yd./carry avg. In 2006, the unit's first full season together, they started every game and allowed just 28 sacks, the lowest total in team history since 1981.

OFFENSIVE TACKLE TANDEM

Not many teams in the NFL can boast the type of offensive tackle tandem the Philadelphia Eagles trot out onto the field each week. Not only are **Jon Runyan** (6-7, 330) and **William Thomas** (6-7, 335) a physically imposing tandem, but they are an extremely reliable and durable pair as well. The duo has started a franchise-record 118 regular season games together as the Eagles offensive tackles.

"They have great experience and are both terrific players," said offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg. "They have both done an excellent job later in their careers of keeping themselves in terrific physical condition on a consistent basis throughout the year. I think that has added years for both of them. They are both terrific players and they both add toughness to the football team."

IRON MAN

Runyan has started 176 straight regular season games (121 as a member of the Eagles), good for the 2nd-longest streak among active NFL players, trailing only Derrick Brooks of the Buccaneers (192). According Stats, Inc., he went all 16 games in 2007 without committing a single penalty.

STABLE STARTER

Thomas has started all but one game he has been active for in his Eagles career. A member of the Eagles since 1998, he has started 149 games for the Eagles and has only missed 10. He currently ranks 4th on the Eagles all-time list for games played by an offensive lineman, and 7th overall.

MR. T REDEDICATES HIMSELF

After feeling that he had a sub-par 2007 season, 4th-year G **Todd Herremans** arrived at training camp with a new car (resembling Mr. T's A-Team van), and a new attitude. Herremans was a staple at the NovaCare complex this past offseason, working hard to re-tool his body and game.

JACK OF HIS TRADE

C **Jamaal Jackson** prides himself on being the "quarterback" of the offensive line, and often spends hours a week watching film with the real quarterback, Donovan McNabb.

"The center has to be one of the smartest guys on the field," said Jackson. However, he also wants to reinvent the position as more than just the brains of the operation. Weighing in at 330 pounds, he is proud to be the biggest center in the NFL (the league average of projected starters in 2008 is 301 pounds). "I'm trying to bring a new dimension to the position, because I'm just as big as most guards."

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

THE BIG GUYS UP FRONT

THE BIG GAME HUNTER

An avid hunter off the field, **Trent Cole** tracks down QBs with as much skill and determination as he takes to the woods. After quietly putting together impressive performances in his first two seasons, Cole registered a career-high 12.5 sacks in 2007, which tied for the 6th-highest total in the NFL and earned him his first-career Pro Bowl appearance.

"He gives his 110% on every snap and players respect him for that," said head coach Andy Reid. "A year or two ago, Brett Favre mentioned that to me just after the game. He said, 'Hey, we were real concerned about 58. He has a phenomenal motor.' We saw it as a staff, but you're never quite sure what the other team sees. It was something that Brett made a point of telling me."

THE MEN IN THE MIDDLE

4th-year DT **Mike Patterson** and 3rd-year DT **Brodrick Bunkley** did a terrific job in 2007 of stifling opposing running backs, while also putting a tremendous amount of pressure on QBs. "Bunk" and "The Grizzle" combined for 7.0 sacks, and were at the forefront of an Eagles defense that allowed only 95.8 rush yds./game, ranking them 7th in the NFL.

"We have something going there, no question about it," said defensive coordinator Jim Johnson. "Mike has been an outstanding player and has really elevated his game. He is there, day in and day out. Bunkley made a big step forward. He was one of the most improved players on this team, considering where he came from. I expect both of those players to continue to improve and be a strength of the defense."

RACKING UP THE TACKLES

With DE **Trent Cole** and DT **Mike Patterson** each eclipsing the 100-tackle mark on the season, they became the first Eagles defensive line tandem to do so since 1991, when the entire D-line had at least 100 tackles apiece (Jerome Brown, 150; Clyde Simmons, 115; Reggie White, 100; Mike Pitts, 100).

SECOND LINE OF DEFENSE

Once considered a question mark on the Eagles defense, the linebackers are now a young, smart, fast and very talented group. **Omar Gaither**, **Chris Gocong**, and **Stewart Bradley** were all selected by the Eagles during the last three drafts. Though none of them is playing at the same position he did in college, each has graciously settled into his respective role and has the coaches excited about what they can do as a unit.

"It's good to have those linebackers that have good size and can run; you don't find those a lot of times," said defensive coordinator Jim Johnson. "A lot of times you find smaller linebackers who can run. We've got some nice size linebackers. Our linebackers are 250-255, but all three of them can run. So that's a nice thing, and they are pretty good blitzers also."

O.G. THE ALL-PURPOSE LB

Third-year LB Omar Gaither emerged as a playmaker and a vocal leader at MIKE linebacker in 2007, after a breakout rookie campaign at WILL. Gaither started all 16 games in 2007, controlling the middle and racking up a team-leading 170 tackles. Coaches were also impressed with his coverage skills (14 KDs, 1 INT on the season), and his ability to pressure opposing QBs (team-leading 14 QB hurries). He is now back in his natural position on the weakside where Johnson will be able to employ him as the playmaker he is.

SHUTTING DOWN THE STRONG SIDE

A prolific sack artist in college, **Chris Gocong** settled into his role as the starting SAM linebacker in his first full season in 2007, a position that showcases his physical style of play. Gocong was strong against the run, tallying 7 TFLs on the season, second only to Trent Cole. He was also used as a "Joker" in certain situations, where he was able to put a great deal of pressure on opposing QBs. Johnson anticipates deploying Gocong in many different ways as he gets more comfortable in the system.

STEWART'S NOT LITTLE

After spending much of the 2007 season on special teams and as a reserve linebacker, Stewart Bradley became the first Eagles rookie to record a sack and an INT in his first-career start on 12/23 at NO. He showed the coaches enough in the last 2 games of the season to earn a job as the starting MIKE linebacker in 2008.

"I think we saw a little bit last year," said Johnson. "We hope it's a continuation. We saw that he's a guy who can run, he's a pretty good blitz. Now we need to see if he can handle the defense as a MIKE linebacker in a crucial situation. Right now, if he just progresses from where he was last year, he'll be fine."

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

CORNERING THE MARKET

The Eagles spent a great deal of time and energy focusing on improving the secondary this past offseason. CBs **Lito Sheppard**, **Sheldon Brown** and newcomer **Asante Samuel** combine to form one of the most prolific cornerback trios in the NFL.

ASANTE SAMUEL

A two-time Super Bowl Champion and one of the premier playmaking defensive backs in recent NFL history, Samuel figures to be a key addition to the Eagles secondary for the 2008 season. He leads the NFL with 16 INTs since 2006, and has 6 career returns for TDs, tops in the NFL since 2003 (including playoffs).

"I think the cornerback position is very important," said head coach **Andy Reid** upon signing the Pro Bowl cornerback. "When you have an opportunity to get the best one in the business, then you need to look at that. I welcome him aboard and I know Jim Johnson has great plans for Asante...Asante is a great player and he'll make great plays for us."

THE LITO SHUFFLE

CB **Lito Sheppard** is one of the top playmaking cornerbacks in the NFL. The two-time Pro Bowl selection consistently shuts down the top receivers in the NFL and has a penchant for coming up with big plays. His 27.1 yds. per INT return leads the NFL since 2003.

Since being drafted by the Eagles in the 2nd round of the 2002 draft, CB **Sheldon Brown** has been a consistent and reliable piece of the Eagles secondary. He has logged 105 consecutive games played (including 9 in the playoffs), which means he has not missed a game in his entire career. Brown's reliability is rare at the cornerback position, as he ranks 4th in the NFL in consecutive games played among CBs.

"I think [he is a good leader] because players have respect for him," said defensive coordinator Jim Johnson. "He has played all positions--the nickel inside and both corners. He's a veteran now, a smart football player. I'm sure they have a lot of respect for him, no question about it. He's still a quiet guy, but he's a soldier."

SAFETY NET

FS **Brian Dawkins** is eager to return to the form that has struck fear into opposing offenses for years. A vocal leader on the field and a quiet-mannered man off of it, Dawkins was admittedly not himself during most of 2007, as he was distracted by family issues in the off-season and later slowed by a stinger he suffered during the season.

"When I get on the field, I don't know what a 34-year old player is supposed to play like, but that's not in my mindset," said Dawkins. "All I know is, if the ball is in the air, I have to get it. If a big hit has to be made, I'm going to make it. If I have to go through somebody to get to the quarterback, I'm going to do it."

Originally signed as a rookie free agent in 2003, S **Quintin Mikell** spent most of his career as a reserve safety and special teams demon. He was thrust into the starting lineup in 2007 while Brian Dawkins recovered from an injury in the early stages of the season, and filled in nicely. He later took over at SS when Sean Considine was placed on IR, and now begins 2008 as the starter at that position.

"Quintin, by the end of the season, was playing at a Pro Bowl caliber level as a safety," said head coach Andy Reid. "We knew what a great special teams player he was. He became an even better safety."

The Eagles were especially stingy in the red zone in 2007, allowing just 20 TDs in 55 possessions (36.4%), which was the lowest pct. in the NFL.

STANDING STRONG:

Over the years, Johnson's units seem to buckle down in goal-line situations. Since 1999, they have faced 108 first-and-goal situations from at-or-inside their own 5-yd. line, allowing only 67 TDs (62.0%) and 27 FGs. During that span, they have allowed the lowest TD% and fewest points per trip (5.09) in the NFL.

In 2007, the Eagles faced 16 first-and-goal situations at-or-inside their own 5-yd. line, allowing only 9 TDs (56.3%), which was the best mark in the NFL.

HOLE STUFFIN'

Philadelphia limited opponents to 95.8 rush yds./game and 3.8 yds./carry, which ranked them 7th and 8th in the NFL, respectively. They also allowed only 80 rushing first downs, ranking them t-6th.

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

Over the final 3 games in 2007 (3-0 record), the Eagles defense held its opponents to a 16.2% conversion rate on 3rd down (6 for 37). Two of the opponents, the Cowboys and Saints, came into each respective game ranked 5th and 1st in 3rd-down offense.

On the season, the Eagles were 10th in the league, holding opponents to 37.2% on 3rd down.

SHUTTING DOWN THE OPPOSITION

The Eagles defense held the opposition without an offensive TD in 5 games in 2007. It was the highest total since 2002, when they did not allow a scrimmage TD in 6 different games.

STRONG ON BOTH SIDES

The Eagles were equally strong on both sides of the ball in 2007 in terms of total yards, as they finished the season ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in both total offense and total defense. They were one of only 4 teams to do so (Indianapolis, New England, Dallas).

After their week 4 game at NYJ, the Eagles were ranked in the top 10, offensively, for the remainder of the season and never dipped lower than 14th, defensively.
